- Summer 2009 Created steering committee, Sent out surveys
- Fall 2009 Hold community tour, Identify focus groups
- Winter 2009 Compile survey data, hold focus group sessions
- Spring 2010 Community Forum, Data analysis
- Summer 2010 Draft Plan is written, Public review of Draft Plan
- Fall 2010 Public comments are incorporated, Plan is finished
- Winter 2010 Presentation of Final Plan, Sent to County & State
- Spring 2011 Get approvals from the Town Board, County & State
